



Health Information for International Travel

The risk of acquiring illness while traveling to a foreign country depends on the area of the world to be visited, the duration of the trip, and the activities performed while traveling. Recommendations for international travelers apply primarily to the type of immunizations and preventive medications needed for US travelers planning to visit areas of the world where infections such as yellow fever, hepatitis, typhoid fever, and malaria occur. **Persons planning travel to areas of the world where these diseases exist should consult with a physician at least 4 weeks before departure.**
